Networking Tips from The Employment Source

The next several months I will be highlighting job search tips from Amy Miller, Resource Room Manager for The Employment Source. Amy has graciously agreed to share her expertise that will help area job seekers find employment. This month's topic is **networking.**

"Networking is an important activity when seeking employment. Networking is basically connecting to people through other people," states Miller.

According to Miller, when you are looking for a job you should talk to friends, relatives, teachers, preachers, politicians and neighbors. The best way to approach others is by saying "I'm looking for a job and I wondered if your employer or someone you know is hiring someone with my skills."

Networking works because managers know good employees are likely to recommend people who are also good workers. Advertising for a job is expensive. Why do it when you can talk to your good workers and find an outstanding person without paying advertising costs?

Miller recommends creating a script for yourself when you are asking someone to give your resume to their employer. You may be very self-conscious as you are asking for a big favor. Having a script will make it easier to ask.

Miller also stresses that you should appreciate your network. Tell them thank you for any help they give you, even if they don't know anyone, ask them to keep you in mind and that you appreciate them.

One last important tip from Miller is a big **don't.** Don't ask someone who you know is not a good worker for a recommendation. An employer will think of you the way they think of your friend. You may not be any type of worker like your friend, but because they are asking for you, you are guilty by association!




