



Canton Children's Dyslexia Center

The Canton Children's Dyslexia Center is at a point of crisis. Based on the current budget, the financial reserves, and projected income levels, Lexington has given the Center two years to get the finances in order or it will be forced to close. At that point, the Center will be unable to start any new students being given two additional years to graduate any remaining students before ending the program.

For over 20 years, your Canton Children's Dyslexia Center has trained tutors to work with children with dyslexia. Many of those tutors work in our schools or tutor privately to mitigate the difficulties these children have with reading. Others have stayed on at the Center, earned advanced certifications, mentored other trainees, supervised their peers, or became directors. During this time, over 150 children have graduated from our program.

It takes a lot of time and effort to make your Children's Dyslexia Center a success. It also takes a lot of money. Our budget for fiscal year 2023, is \$100,000. The Center gets that money from a lot of different sources; our corporate office in Lexington, Massachusetts, grants, charitable organizations, fundraisers, and individual donors. In recent years, we have seen changes happening with many of these sources. We no longer receive funding from Lexington. In fact, they require us to provide them with money each year. Charitable organizations change their focus to reflect the immediate needs of the community. They may still support us in other ways, but they are less able to provide for us financially. Our recent fundraisers have been generally unsuccessful necessitating changes in our efforts. And while donations from individual donors remain at levels comparable to other recent years, we cannot survive on those donations at their current level.

As the interim chair for the Board of Governors of the Canton Children's Dyslexia Center, I am asking for your help. Over the coming months, the Board of Governors will be rolling out new initiatives or creating more clarity regarding existing ways you can help support our Center. We appreciate any support you can provide for events, as they are announced. We are eager to speak with anyone who may wish to serve on committees to help get new fundraisers off the ground. 
