

The Long Walk Home

A veteran's barefoot journey across America

When Ron Zaleski returned home from his service to the Marine Corps in 1972, he was plagued by feelings of anger and guilt. As an act of penance, in 2006 he walked barefoot across the Appalachian Trail, where he learned self-forgiveness, empathy, and found a purpose greater than himself. In 2010 he upped the stakes and walked barefoot from Concord, MA to Santa Monica, CA. He traversed over 3,400 miles without shoes, all the while carrying a sign that read "18 Vets a Day Commit Suicide!" and a petition for military personnel to receive mandatory counseling. Along the way, he made connection and experienced things that would change him forever. "The Long Walk Home" recounts Ron's remarkable transformation from disgruntled Veteran to trailblazing advocate for hope and change.

He founded The Long Walk Home a 501© 3 nonprofit dedicated to serving Veterans and their families. His mission is to help end war and Veterans suicide.

Building a Brighter Future, One Child at a Time.

A student's first introduction to the Dyslexia Center, following parental contact, is a visit.

Where they are introduced to the staff and the directors. The directors will complete the initial testing, this testing will serve as a benchmark towards measuring their growth during the next two years.

Testing consists of letters, sounds, spelling and reading comprehension. The testing is done in a friendly environment, without fear of wrong or incomplete answers. If possible, the child will meet their tutor in order to ease any apprehension about their first lesson

The first lesson for a new student at the Children's Dyslexia Center involves student and tutor acclimating to one another. The student is asked about favorite things and activities. The atmosphere is friendly and non-threatening.

At that point, the student maybe asked to say and write the alphabet and if time permits, the phoneme cards may be introduced. These are cards with letters of the alphabet along with other letters and sounds, such as /sh/ and /th/ which are called digraphs. The tutor begins with the alphabet letters and asks the student for the sound. Any mispronounced sounds will be corrected. It is important to remediate at the time of the error. The tutor may decide to do a pretest of letters and sounds, if deemed necessary and time permits. A lesson lasts for 50 minutes.

The second visit will include a lesson with their tutor, in which the protocol for future lessons will be established. So that the student will see a pattern emerge and they will become comfortable with the predictability.

Rarely, if ever, is a child worried about lessons, because they understand and appreciate the caring atmosphere that permeates throughout the center.

Each lesson will end with a 15 minute reading by the student or in correlation with the tutor.

No work is ever sent home with students as they may have homework assignments from their teachers at their schools.
