

On land or on sea, or in jets high above.


They went out of duty and honor and love.

Please bless them and help them to know what it meant!



### **Memorial Day**

This Day of Honor was First Proclaimed by Brother Major General John A. Logan

Major General John A. Logan was one of the most famous Union Army generals of the Civil War. After the war, Logan became a fierce advocate for the cause of Veterans, and was a driving force behind the creation of Memorial Day as a national holiday. He was also a Freemason, raised in Mitchell Lodge No. 85 in Pinckneyville, Illinois. Logan Lodge No. 575 in Indianapolis, chartered in 1888, is named in honor of Brother Logan.

Memorial Day (originally known as Decoration Day) was made official on May 5, 1868 by General Logan in his role as national commander of the fraternal group, the Grand Army of the Republic. It was first observed on May 30th of that year when flowers were placed on the graves of both Union and Confederate soldiers at Arlington National Cemetery.

Here is the first section of the "Memorial Day Order": HEADQUARTERS GRAND ARMY OF THE REPUBLIC General Orders No.11, WASHINGTON, D.C., May 5, 1868

The 30th day of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village, and hamlet church-yard in the land. In this observance no form of ceremony is prescribed, but posts and comrades will in their own way arrange such fitting services and testimonials of respect as circumstances may permit.

In the Gettysburg Address, Abraham Lincoln called upon us to never forget those who have given the "last full measure of devotion" to their country. Through our remembrance on this Memorial Day, May 29,2023, we continue to honor and pay tribute.

### CHILDREN'S DYSLEXIA CENTER

As you all know we are a nonprofit organization. For us to continue doing what we do, we need raise funds. We have an opportunity with the Akron Rubberducks, working in their concession stands. We are NOT requiring anyone to volunteer, but this is a good way for us to try and raise the funds we need to keep operating.

What the Akron Rubberducks do for nonprofits like us, is that they let the organizations run their concession stands during all their events and home games. We get either \$50 per person, or 10% of the concession sales, whichever is HIGHER. You would have to be there during the entire game/event. Help open and prep the concession stand, then help clean up and close it down after the game has ended. This means, using a point-of-sale system; making popcorn and boxing it up, filling nacho trays with chips and cheese. Making pretzels; wrapping hotdogs and serving beer and drinks. Making sure the condiment stand is tidy and full.

We (as an organization) are required to work at least 8 games. But we can have just one person or as many as 20. Brian Somers and I will be volunteering for some games in April and May. Their season is April to September. Every Friday and Saturday they have fireworks at the ballpark. so, bigger money-making days for us. They allow children as young as 10 to help, any children 14 and under has to have a parent or guardian with them.
