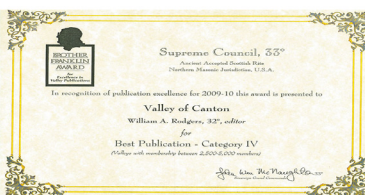

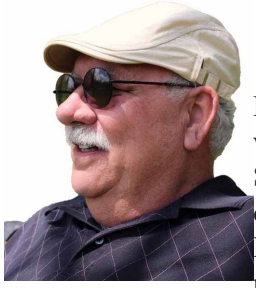

NEW SOVEREIGN GRAND COMMANDER



2023 - 2024 DUES STATEMENT

Membership & Program Development would like to provide you with a couple of updates regarding the 2023-2024 dues generation process and new membership card.

1. Members will be able to log on to Member Center and pay their dues online if they are registered.
2. Membership renewal statements will start hitting mail boxes.
3. A new membership card for our veterans that includes a flag with six stars representing our core values on the front along with the logo VETERAN and a single star on the back where their information is displayed has been added.
4. Going forward, the membership card included with the 2023-2024 renewals, will serve as a **permanent card**. The year has been replaced with a QR code and in the event that a member misplaces their card, they can log on to Member Center and generate a temporary PDF version of their card. We are also working with a vendor towards offering our members with the ability to opt in and receive a digital card. We will still have the ability to print a physical card for our members if needed. Simply submit a request on J365 and let me know that you have!
5. Finally, along with the membership renewals this year, our members will receive a buck slip for the opportunity to opt in and share their Masonic Story. A vendor, PCI, will be compiling these stories into a book that will be available to all our members for purchase. Please note that this is entirely optional, and members can opt out.

The Masonic Service Association (MSA) --WWII

Under executive director Carl Claudy, the Masonic Service Association was reinvigorated and an advisory committee of several U. S. Congressmen and Senators was established. Through the Masonic network, the MSA began opening service centers – similar to the USO canteens for all women and men in uniform, more especially Masons. To help promote the centers, Senator Harry Truman made radio broadcasts and Hollywood produced the film Your Son is My Brother in 1944. By the end of the war in 1945, the MSA had raised more than \$5 million to support some 40 at home and abroad.

Chief Joseph Brant A Mohawk Indian

Chief Brant, the principal chief of the Six Nations is the first known Native American to become a Freemason. He joined Hiram's Lodge 447, London in 1776.

During the War for Independence, Brant was loyal to the British Crown but was credited for saving the lives of several colonists including brother Masons. After the war he moved to Ontario with his tribe and in 1798 became the master of his lodge. His son was also a Freemason.
