VALLEY of CANTON SUPPORTING THE MILITARY

The A.A.S.R Valley of Canton is a staunch supporter of our Military Community. The Valley currently has 158 members who have registered as a veteran in j365, of which 5 are on active duty; sadly 23 are deceased. These Brother Veterans are recognized each November at or near Veterans Day by having a special program for our Veterans. It is held in place of the Valley's Stated November Meeting.

The Valley held its first Veterans Day recognition program in November of 2016, when the Fraternity held a nationwide day to honor all our veterans. The Valley of Canton had as guest speaker Brother Donald E. Ballard, Medal of Honor recipient. In honor of the occasion, there was a dinner, and entertainment was provided by the Hall of Fame Chorus.

The Valley did not hold another program until 2019. The key note speaker for this Veterans Recognition program was Colonel Dominic S. Fago, the Commander of the 179th Airlift Wing Maintenance Group, Ohio National Guard, Mansfield, Ohio. As part of the November 14TH Stated Meeting, the Valley of Canton Honored its Veterans by formally recognizing their service to our country by presenting them with the Sammy Lee Davis Lapel Pin and Certificate. A buffet dinner preceded the festivities.

The next Veterans Recognition program was not until 2021, as 2020 was closed due to COVID-19. On Veterans Day, November 11^{th,} the Valley of Canton held its third Veterans Recognition Event for all member Veterans. This was an open event with Hot Hors D'oeuvres available, and special speaker, the Valley's Bro. Donald Ballard, Medal of Honor Recipient. Each attending Veteran received a commemorative Masonic coin showing each of the Military Branches on one side and the Square and Compass on the other side. They were also given a Patriotic Tote Bag made by students of a local middle school.

On November 10th, 2022, the Valley of Canton held its fourth Recognition observance for all its Veteran members. This was in place of the normal Stated Meeting. This event was open to the public and consisted of a Buffet Dinner along with Mrs. De Ann Williams, Executive Director for the Stark County Veterans Service Commission as the guest speaker. Each Veteran present received a mug with an emblem of his Military branch on one side and the Scottish Rite emblem on the other side. Brother Donald E. Ballard, Medal of Honor recipient and Valley member was also in attendance for this occasion.

On November 9, 2023, the fifth Veterans Recognition Program was held. The Program began with Brother Ernest Kuley and Ms. Kim Meeks playing the Bagpipes, entertaining us with a number of patriotic tunes. The program continued with a Buffett Dinner and a special guest speaker, Brigadier General Thomas P. Luczyski Retired. The program also included the presentation of his White Hat and Jewel to Ill. Donald E. Ballard, 33°, Medal of Honor, by Ill Frank L. Sekeres, 33°, Deputy's Representative to the Valley of Canton

Those Veteran members in attendance, were each recognized and received a Garden Flag showing the "Valley of Canton" and their Service Branch, along with a License Plate showing the same. Ill Donald E. Ballard, 33°, MoH presented each Veteran a "SRNMJ Veterans Ribbon."

The Valley membership has shown its support in many different ways. Brother Sherman Brick, MSA is one of the 5 Commissioners for the Veterans Service Commission of Stark County. Brother Timothy Novelli, Doctor of Chiropractic started the Patriot Project, a 501 C (3) non-Profit Organization over 11 years ago in North Canton, Ohio. Today there are approximately 9,000 Chiropractors (nationwide) that are part of this program. The Patriot Program provides free chiropractic treatment to all Active Military, Veterans, and First responders who were injured while on duty. The program also includes Gold Star Families. Another Masonic Brother, in 2015, Veteran Bryan Bowman started the SAM Center (Serving Area Military and Veterans) a 501 C (3) nonprofit organization serving veterans in a 5-county area. Their objective is to provide food by means of food distribution.

The Ill.Sammy Lee Davis, 33°Defender of Peace and Freedom veterans recognition program is offered to Scottish Rite, NMJ members honorably discharged from the United States Military or Uniformed Services; also included is current active duty members.

Veterans will receive a custom-designed pin and certificate to commemorate their military service and to honor their dedication to the core values of 32° Scottish Rite Freemasonry.

SERVING AREA MILITARY & VETERANS (SAM CENTER)

Brother Bryan Bowman's SAM Center (Serving Area Military and Veterans) is located in Massillon, Ohio It, s objective is to provide food by means of food distribution. In 2022, the SAM Center provided more than 600,000 pounds of food for veteran families while helping 102 homeless veterans transition to housing.

The SAM Center provides a complete holiday meal for Veteran Families at Thanksgiving and Christmas. The Center also provides toys at Christmas for families. This year, the SAM Center handed out over 500 complete turkey dinners for Thanksgiving on November 21, 2023. The next big event was the toy give away and Christmas dinner hand out in mid-December. Just this year, the SAM Center opened a second facility as a Veterans Resource Center. There, veterans participate in guitar and art therapy programs as well as a meeting place for veterans to be together.

The SAM Center provides veterans with other resources by hosting Veterans Resource Fairs throughout the year. Valley members volunteer to help the organization throughout the year at the different events. The Patriot Project also participates in these Veterans Resource Fairs and at the Pro Football Hall of Fame Festival

When serving as a Hospital Corpsman attached to a Marine Company during the Vietnam War, he received the Medal of Honor for conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life and beyond the call of duty. He is one of two Navy Corpsman still alive that received the Medal of Honor.


